### Questions for the state of West Virginia Offices of the Insurance Commissioner (OIC)

---

1. Under Qualified Reinsurance Firms there are a three situations that need to be reviewed:
  - The \$1 billion in reinsurance premium may disqualify several US based markets who offer great security. The problem is that a reinsurer, Axis Re for example, has several platforms for writing US business including the US, Bermuda and London. I would suggest that this requirement be changed to one billion of reinsurance on a Group basis. Also the 5 year requirement is a bit onerous – perhaps it can be shortened to 3 years?
  - The above qualification also disqualifies Lloyd's of London since very few, if any, individual Syndicates have premium volumes of \$1 billion. I would suggest that Lloyd's be viewed in its entirety – if so, their premium volume is certainly well in excess of \$1 billion.
  - \$100 million in WC premium cannot be met by very many, if any, broker / reinsurer markets. There is not enough WC reinsurance placed on an excess of loss basis in the US to support such a premium volume threshold. Considering the nature of the program, the WC reinsurance premium qualification in our opinion is not necessary. Reinsurers who write WC are quite aware of the unique nature of this line of business and have the actuarial, underwriting, and claims skills to successfully support it. It is also incumbent on your broker to know the markets and which of them will best serve your needs. Guy Carpenter will provide full financial information on each reinsurer who authorizes on the final "firm order terms" for the OIC's review and approval prior to binding lines.
  - Instead of the \$1 billion suggested, please consider reducing the qualification to \$500,000,000 of US business for the Group. This is still a worthy qualification for reinsurers in addition to their financial ratings qualifier. This change would bring into play several excellent markets for this type of business. The other bullet points remain unchanged.

**Answer: Based on the above, the OIC makes the following amendments to the RFQ section entitled "Qualified Reinsurance Firms" for all potential bidders, replacing the requirement that bidders have five (5) consecutive years of experience of having written at least \$1 billion in reinsurance with at least \$100 million being workers' compensation: (1) Has written at least \$1 bill of global reinsurance or \$500,000,000 of US reinsurance on a group basis (i.e. all corporate affiliates, syndicates, etc.) over the past three (3) years (replacing requirement; and (2) remove requirement that a "qualified reinsurance firm" have written \$100 million in WC reinsurance.**

2. Under Acceptance Period for Quotations expecting reinsurers to leave their quote open for 6 months may not be feasible. Almost every reinsurer quote received these days has a 30 day expiration. Due to "unforeseen events" (financial, natural, or political that can greatly impact the UEF's loss potential or exposures) reinsurers do not feel it is in their best interests to leave quotes open for such a lengthy period. Having said that, most reinsurers understand the RFQ process for a governmental body and that it takes time to make decisions. If there is little change in the risk and reinsurance environment, most reinsurers would be pleased to reinstate their quote at the appropriate time.

**Answer: Based on the above, the OIC makes the following amendment to the RFQ section entitled "Acceptance Period for Quotations" for all potential bidders: The quotations submitted in response to the RFQ shall remain fixed and valid for a period of thirty (30) days commencing on the date the quotations are due.**

3. In the Products Potentially Desired section and the Cost Sheet, please confirm that the you are seeking quotes for a two layered structure – the first layer being \$8,000,000 excess \$2,000,000 with a \$2 mil MAOL; \$7,000,000 xs \$3,000,000 with a \$3 mil MAOL and \$8,000,000 excess \$2,000,000 with a \$3,000,000 MAOL / the second layer being \$10,000,000 xs \$10,000,000 would be in excess of the aforementioned first layer.

**Answer: The OIC is soliciting quotations for the three primary layers noted above all with the option of a second layer as described above. However, bidders may submit pricing for any of the primary layers by themselves; pricing for any of the primary layers plus the secondary layer as a package deal; pricing for the secondary layer by itself as secondary in excess of any of the primary layers; or any combination thereof. Then the OIC will review the various prices submitted and select its desired coverages based on the lowest quotes.**

4. Additional Data needed:

Reinsurers would like to see all exposure/for all employers/for all years and group up loss data for each year as follows:

- Exposure data – By year since 2006, please list all uninsured employers including: duration of coverage lapse; major class code(s); # of employees &/or payroll; and address. This information will enable reinsurers to build a model portfolio based on the UEP's own history which can then be utilized for determining appropriate excess rates and catastrophe potential. Although we know that the UEF has no account portfolio as such since the roster of uninsured employers is constantly changing, reinsurers need data of some type to determine UEP's loss potential. I am confident that this data will greatly assist us in developing the best quotes for you. **Please send in electronic format so we can manipulate the data.**
- Details on the two large claims mentioned in the RFI (one reserved at \$526,352 and the other at \$358,306).
- Can the RFI narrative section titled Current Status of UEF be updated through the latest possible date (9/30/12 would be okay)? We realize this may overlap with the above requests, but it would be appreciated.

- Claims data – Please provide a report of all individual claims from the ground up since 2006 for all years including; DOL; paid/outstanding medical, indemnity, and expenses; status (open/closed); brief description of cause and injuries; class code. **Please send in electronic format so we can manipulate the data.**
- Can Attachment 2 in the RFI be updated through the latest possible date (again, 9/30/12 would be okay)?

**Answer: Please see attachments 1 and 2 which are responsive to most of these requests. Please note some of detail level data (such as each employer's address) was not readily able to be compiled. Also please note that there is some claims level data which the OIC cannot divulge due to statutory confidentiality requirements.**

5. Premium by year since inception (last 3-5 years at a minimum). Estimated premium for 2013.

**Answer: Not applicable. The UEF is not an insurer; it is a statutory state fund which covers injured West Virginia employees whose employer was not covered with workers' compensation on the date of insurance. See RFQ for more details and W. Va. Code 23-2C-8 and W. Va. Code St. R. 23-2-9.**

6. Assets of the West Virginia Uninsured Employers Fund.

**Answer: Please see Attachment 3.**

7. Description of all losses greater than \$100,000 (if Clash, then excess of \$500,000).

**Answer: Please see attachment 2. Please note that there is some claims level data which the OIC cannot divulge due to statutory confidentiality requirements.**

8. Historical Class Codes/Hazard Groups. Estimated breakdown for 2013\*.

**Answer: See attachment 1; note only summary data available. No estimated 2013 data available.**

9. Is there any exposure outside of West Virginia?

**Answer: No. The UEF only covers employees who are injured and entitled to West Virginia workers' compensation coverage at the time of their injury due to their employment circumstances, but whose employer is not covered. This generally would be injuries physically in WV while working for a WV employer. However, WV's WC laws do cover WV workers while working temporarily out of state.**

10. Historical Employee concentration data.

**Answer: This information is not available.**

11. The RFQ requests terms for clash cover for a primary \$10m plus an additional \$10mx\$10, although the \$10mx\$2m option with a \$3m MAOL partially exposes that layer to a life. This structure is very achievable, however, it is not in line with our original understanding of structure, so please clarify that no per person exposed coverage is needed.

**Answer: The OIC's understanding of any quoted product is that the primary and secondary layer would cover occurrences involving two or more injuries. Therefore, no coverage under the treaty would be triggered unless two persons were injured in the occurrence. However, if, for example, two persons were injured and the retention level of \$2m was not reached on one, but was reached on another, then the \$3m MAOL product would cover the latter person.**

12. Can the Excess be written as insurance or reinsurance? If only reinsurance, it will likely be subject to limited reinstatements, and sunset and commutation. Is that workable?

**Answer: The OIC would consider excess insurance providing the same basic coverage terms requested as the reinsurance requested in the RFQ. The terms of any excess insurance or reinsurance contract would be subject to final approval of the OIC. However, the OIC would likely accept terms and conditions that are standard in the industry.**

13. Is there an annual estimate of premium for the 553 uninsured workers' compensation accounts? Prior years?

**Answer: This information is unavailable at this time.**

14. Is there an annual estimate of payroll for the 553 uninsured workers' compensation accounts? Prior years?

**Answer: This information is unavailable at this time.**

15. Is the uninsured employer required to pay claims dollar for dollar? If so does this represent potential subrogation for the Excess?

**Answer: Yes, employers whose employees receive benefits from the UEF are liable on a "dollar for dollar" basis to the UEF, as well as claim administrative costs, the attorney fees for defending the claim (if applicable) and a fine of up to \$10,000. This would represent a potential subrogation for the excess/reinsurer.**

16. Are there any Closed Claims above \$500,000 (only Open claims were provided)?

**Answer: Yes**

17. Provide a breakdown of individual losses, broken down by year.

**Answer: Please see attachment 2. Please note that there is some claims level data which the OIC cannot divulge due to statutory confidentiality requirements.**

## Summary of UEF Spreadsheet Data

Prepared: December 7, 2012

- As of September 30, there appeared to be 281 employers without coverage.
- From 7/1/2009 through September 30, 2012, there were 9,677 uninsured defaulted accounts with a total number of uninsured days in the amount of 1,055,431 days. This calculates out to an average of 125 days uninsured per account.
- All Fiscal year data is from 7/1/2009 and after. If an account had a liability date prior to 7/1/2009, it appears on the spreadsheet but will not be in the Fiscal year calculations.
- Of the 9,677 uninsured defaulted accounts, there were 1,091 repeat offenders. These employers had at least 2 or more uninsured accounts during the period. Statistics are as follows:
  - 1 employer with 5 accounts
  - 22 employers with 4 accounts
  - 135 employers with 3 accounts
  - 933 employers with 2 accounts
